



Q. Looks like you'll be in the final group tomorrow?

BERNHARD LANGER: It's always fun to be in contention. It's what we practice for and work for all year long. It's great to be in the last group and have the people inside that may win. But you never know, somebody can come from up front and shoot a real low number and pass everybody.

Q. How do you explain just the way you've been playing this year? It's certainly been impressive.

BERNHARD LANGER: Thank you, I appreciate it. It's been a great year. I played decent the last nine years, too, so it's not a total surprise. I've just been very steady and have a great coach, good caddie and great family to support me, so just giving my best every time. The game is not just mental, it's a lot of technique and pacing yourself and having everything, it's like a mosaic thing, a puzzle, you've got to have all the pieces in order.

Q. Jeff Maggert's at 14 now, it looks like you'll probably have the lead. Do you like having that guy in the lead with you on that final day?

BERNHARD LANGER: Yeah, it doesn't matter. I'm going to have to play my golf and go as low as I can. Certainly when I'm 4 or 5 behind, I don't know where he's going to end up. 18 is a possible birdie hole anyway, so I'm going to have to go really low and get off to a good start.

Q. Does it feel like this is a course a guy can go really low on?

BERNHARD LANGER: We've seen it, we've seen 61s and stuff like that here so it's out there. It's going to be cold tomorrow, the ball won't travel as far. It will be a little more uncomfortable. But nevertheless, if you're comfortable with your swing and with your putter, you can go low.

Q. You talked earlier this week about your best season on the Champions Tour, two majors and five wins. What would it mean to you tomorrow to match that season?

BERNHARD LANGER: It would mean a lot. Every time you win it means a lot. I've never won in Canada. I haven't played here much, but it's a great tournament they run and Shaw's doing a great job. It would mean a great deal for me to win in Canada and have my third Champions Tour victory.

Q. I know you said you haven't played a lot here. Have you been close in Canada?

BERNHARD LANGER: Not really. Once I was close but I've only played three times in Canada
