### First-Round Notes – Friday, September 2, 2016

Weather: Mostly cloudy and cool with temperatures ranging from a high of 64 in the morning to the upper-40s later in the day. Thunderstorms moved through the area in the afternoon, forcing a stoppage of play from 2:15 to 5:15 p.m. Variable wind 6-12 mph.

#### *Shaw Charity Classic R1 Notes...*

David Frost has played 37 straight holes without a bogey at the Shaw Charity Classic. Since he bogeyed No. 17 during the second round in 2015, Frost shot a bogey-free 65 in the final round leading to a T12 finish, and on Friday he carded a bogey-free 62. In that span, he has nine birdies, two eagles and 26 pars.

The 62 is the best first round of Frost's PGA TOUR Champions career, and it is one shot off his career-best round of 61 (2010 3M Championship).

In four appearances at the Shaw Charity Classic, Frost has opened with rounds of 65, 63, 69 and 62 (64.75 average). His previous finishes at this event are T10 (2013), T9 (2014) and T12 (2015).

Along with Frost, three other players have opened with an 8-under-par 62 at the Shaw Charity Classic: Bart Bryant (2014), Tom Pernice Jr. (2014) and Colin Montgomerie (2015).

David Frost made a pair eagles on Friday on Nos. 11 and 18. Gene Sauers also posted a pair of eagles on Nos. 11 and 18.

Jose Coceres shot a 72 during Tuesday's qualifier, making him the sixth and final player to earn his way into the tournament. On Friday, he shot a 7-under-par 63 and through 18 holes, he leads the field in birdies (9), total putts (23) and one-putts (12).



Two days before his 67th birthday, Tom Watson shot a 5-under-par 65. It is the fourth time he has shot his age on PGA TOUR Champions and second time this season.

The par-70 layout at Canyon Meadows Golf & Country Club only offers players three par 5s, and defending champion Jeff Maggert took advantage of all three of those opportunities on Friday. He played this trio of holes in 4-under-par, making birdie on Nos. 4 and 18 and an eagle on No. 11. In 2015, he was 5-under-par on the par 5s.

Thanks to four birdies on the back nine, Charles Schwab Cup points leader Bernhard Langer opened with a 5-under-par 65.

Tom Byrum is off to a good start, firing a 6-under-par 64 and is fourth overall. Byrum also shot a 64 (7-under) in the final round here in 2013 and it led to a second-place finish.

Mark O'Meara opened with a 2-under-68 and it was his 10th consecutive round in the 60s in this event.

Friday's weather delay was just the fourth weather-related issue this year. The opening round at the Mississippi Gulf Coast Resort was postponed due to rain and the start of the second round of the Regions Tradition was delayed 30 minutes due to rain. The other was at the U.S. Senior Open when Sunday's final round was postponed due to heavy rains until Monday. That round was delayed four hours due to rain.

Tommy Armour III withdrew prior to the start of his round with a bad back. He was replaced by Mike Grob, who started the week as the 13th alternate.
